UNIT 58 Passive form – present and past tenses

A. Look at the table below that compares the active form and the passive form of the present and past tenses in the third person singular.

tense	active	passive
present simple	... makes	... is made
present continuous	... is making	... is being made
past simple	... made	... was made
past continuous	... was making	... was being made

Note that the verb **be** in the passive form keeps the same tense as the active verb.

They built the bridge last year.
The bridge **was built** last year.

B. The use of tenses in passive sentences is identical to that in active sentences. For example, for habitual actions, we use the present simple for actions that have been completed, we use the past simple, and so on. Here are a few examples using the tenses in the table.

Present simple
Gaelic football is played in Ireland. (general statement)
Breakfast is served in the cafeteria. (usually)

Present continuous
A match of Gaelic football is being played between the rival teams of Galway and Kilkenny. (the match is underway)
Breakfast is being served in the cafeteria. (in this moment of time)
The houses are being rebuilt after the tsunami. (in this period time)

Past simple
The internal structure of the Statue of Liberty was designed by Gustave Eiffel in the 19th century.
The road was repaired in three days. (the work is finished)

Past continuous
The road was being repaired, so we had to find an alternative route. (the work was in progress, they hadn't yet finished)
Our luggage was being checked while we were waiting in the security area.

C. The passive form can also be formed using the verb **get** instead of **be**, in particular for actions that happened unexpectedly. This use is common in informal spoken language.
Luckily, no one got injured in the crash.
We got most of a profit.

How Vegan Diets Affect Your Workouts by Cory Stieg

During Soccer World Cup game U.S. forward Alex Morgan scored five goals, helping the U.S. Women's National Team clinch the victory 13 to zero over Thailand. Morgan is definitely one of the stars to watch this World Cup. Whether you're a soccer player or just an awe-struck spectator, you might be wondering how on earth Morgan accomplishes these superhuman feats.

Of course, professional athletes have highly specific training routines that allow them to perform at their peak potential. But in a recent interview with TIME, Morgan revealed that switching to a vegan diet has been key to her success on the field. She first adopted a vegan diet because as she said in "I didn't feel fair to have a dog I adore, and yet eat meat all the time."

Morgan certainly isn't the first high-profile athlete to praise a vegan diet; everyone from Venus Williams to Colin Kaepernick have spoken about the so-called benefits before. But in this a side effect of the overall trend toward veganism, or could going vegan actually help your workout routine?

Currently, no research has shown that vegan or vegetarian eating patterns improve athletic performance compared to omnivorous eating. We know that athletes who exercise at a very high intensity, often multiple times a day, require more calories (aka energy), carbohydrates, protein, and fat to support their training loads.

North America is home to people from all over the world. Some are the **descendants** of Native Americans who have lived on the continent for thousands of years, while others are the children of European immigrants who have lived in North America for hundreds of years or for only a few generations. There are also millions of people who descend from African slaves brought to North America as part of the transatlantic slave trade that flourished up until the 19th century.

It's believed that the earliest North Americans were people who arrived from Asia thousands of years ago and became the **indigenous** people we now call Native Americans. Historians believe that Asians crossed a **bridge** of land or ice connecting present-day Russia and Alaska tens of thousands of years ago. They **slowly migrated** southeast in search of more favorable climate.

In the 15th and 17th centuries, people from England, Holland, France, and Spain were among the first to open to **establish** colonies. Using **veganism** access to the Atlantic Ocean were made by people seeking economic **opportunities**, or they sought freedom from political or religious **persecution** in their homelands. The Spanish established colonies in Central America and what is now Mexico and the southwestern area of the United States. The British concentrated on colonizing the east coastal regions, while French explorers, traders, and settlers settled in the Midwest and areas around Canada.

Today immigrants continue to arrive in North America from Asia and Africa. Immigration from European **descendants** has slowed down **gradually** with the exception of countries like Russia and Ukraine. The two most popular destinations on the continent are the United States and Canada. Thanks to large waves of immigration over the last few hundred years, North America benefits tremendously from the rich diversity of people and culture found within its borders.

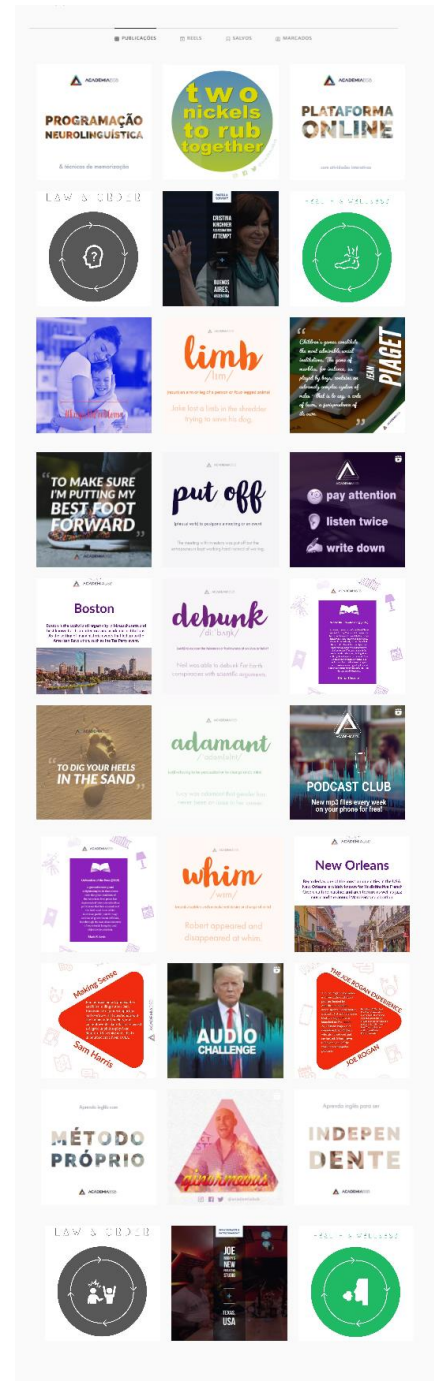

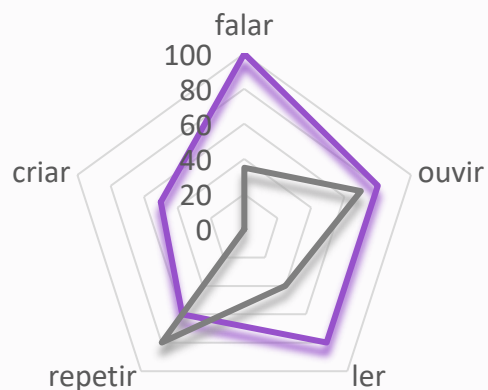

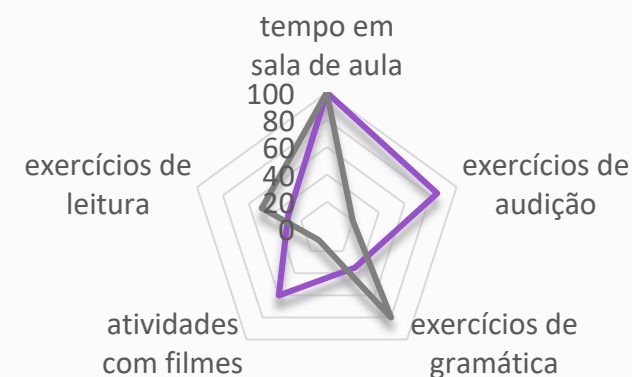
