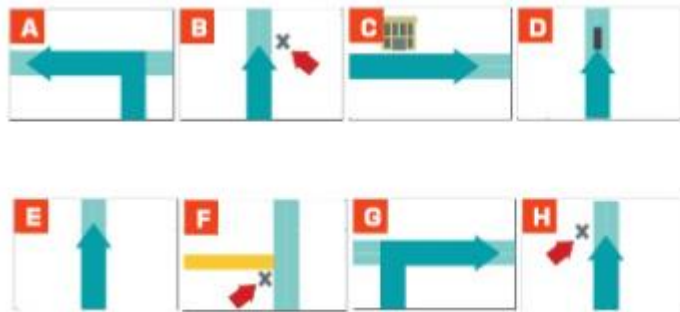

UNIT 73 Possessive case (*Tom's friend, A friend of Tom's*)

To indicate the possession of something, affiliation or kinship, we use the possessive case.

A

The possessive case is formed by placing the noun that refers to the possessor before the object that they possess (without any article!) and by adding 's to the possessor when the possessor is:

- a singular noun.

the bag of the teacher → the teacher's bag

the garden of my neighbour → my neighbour's garden

the twin sister of Samantha → Samantha's twin sister

- a plural noun that doesn't end in -s.

the children's toys

Only the apostrophe is added when the possessor is a plural noun that ends in -s.

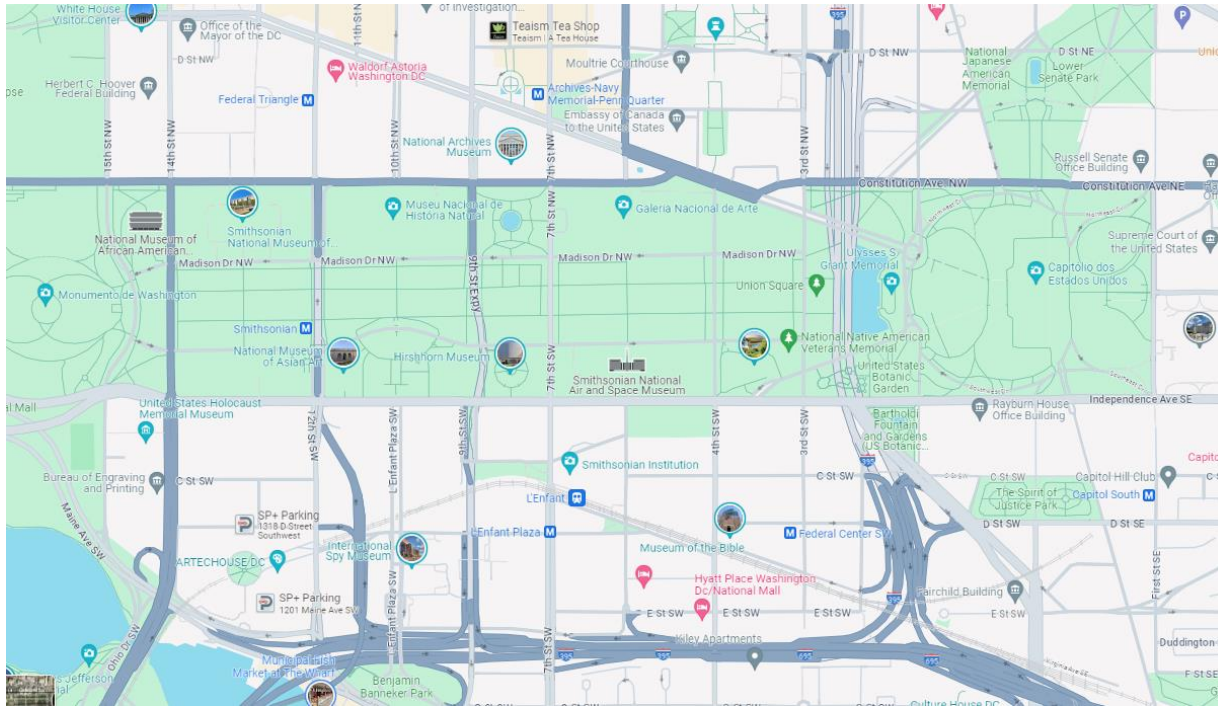

Man: Jefferson Drive.

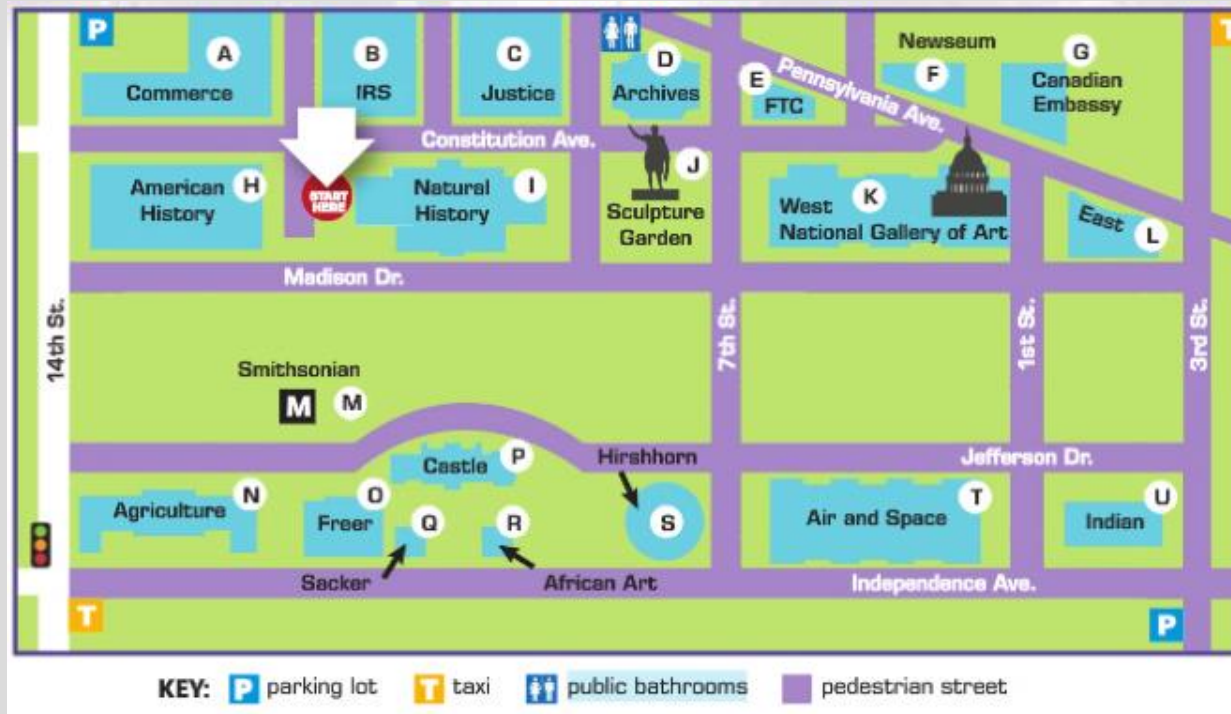
Woman: Jefferson Drive. Right, thanks.
